GENERAL INFORMATION

The Religious Education Program is meant to supplement the religious formation already happening in the home. Parents are the first and foremost educators of their children.

As a community of the faithful, we pledge to provide instruction in the Catholic faith and encourage participation in one of the weekend Masses. Parents, students, and teachers recognize the importance of Religious Education and cooperate to make the most of the student's learning opportunities and faith formation.

WHAT IS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION?

This is a program that teaches young people in the parish about our Catholic faith. This includes preparation for the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), Eucharist (Holy Communion), and Confirmation. Religious Education classes are open to all young people in grades 1 through 8. It is recommended families of these young people be registered members of Sacred Heart; however, exceptions are made if permission is given by our pastor, Monsignor Frank Lane. All are welcome.

GOALS OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- 1. To expose and promote students to basic Catholic doctrine, Prayer, and Scripture.
- 2. To assist in spiritual growth and ways to live their faith.
- 3. To encourage students to attend Sunday Mass and religious education classes.
- 4. To teach and enhance celebration of all the Sacraments.
- 5. To live a life dedicated in service to God, the parish, and the community.
- 6. To help students discern their vocation in life toward the priesthood, religious life, marriage, or single status.

REGISTRATION FORM

All children are welcome, including the grandchildren of grandparents. Registration and class begin on September 15 immediately following the 11:00 am Mass in the rectory living room; however, registration forms can also be found on the at the Sacred Heart Website, sacredheartchurchcolumbus.org.

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

A diocesan requirement is for each catechist to attend one class, which lasts around 4 hours. These classes are held throughout the diocese. Those who attend will be reimbursed by the parish. Background check and finger printing are also mandatory, and the parish will also reimburse for this. Information for both requirements will be provided.

FEES

There are no fee requirements for this program.

PARENT EXPECTATIONS

- 1. Share your Catholic faith with your child.
- 2. Attend Mass every weekend and Holy Days with your child.
- 3. Be on time. Parents are expected to accompany their children to their classroom following Mass, and pick them up promptly at 12:45 p.m.
- 4. Show interest in the lessons and projects your child brings home, and talk with them about their experience in class.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

It is essential that respect, cooperation, support, and courtesy be shown by all those involved in the Religious Education Program. We are a family, and the behavior is a reflection belonging to the family. Parents, please review the following rules of behavior with your child.

- 1. Respect teacher, assistants, and classmates.
- 2. Use respectful language.
- 3. Cooperate with requests made by the teachers and assistants.
- 4. Respect the property of Sacred Heart Parish.
- 5. Listen while others are speaking and participate in class discussions and projects.
- 6. Be open to learning about the Catholic faith in a friendly and enjoyable atmosphere.

DISCIPLINE ISSUES

The philosophy of discipline is based on the approach of self-discipline and the need to help students live in the image of Jesus Christ. To ensure that all students have the maximum

opportunity to receive the most out of their religious education experience, discipline must be maintained to provide a positive atmosphere for all. At times, a parent might be required to accompany a child.
